How can community-led approaches build thriving neighbourhoods?

Tuesday 22 October 16:30 to 18:00, followed by drinks Piccolino, Harrogate

Our neighbourhoods are dealing with the fallout of big national challenges – the cost-of-living crisis, pressures on public services and a flagging economy. Some are more resilient than others. Effective responses require highly adaptive approaches – even neighbourhoods that are next to each other might have widely varying outcomes. This fringe session will draw together a range of perspectives on effective neighbourhood working, and focus on practical examples of what works. We will explore the following questions:

- How can councils effectively support community capacity, particularly in areas experiencing low levels of social capital?
- What does it mean for the council to be working in ways that are adaptive to the needs of different neighbourhoods?
- How can communities take a lead on neighbourhood renewal and what does this mean for the role of the council ?
